Name of Lesson: <u>Chicka Chicka Boom Boom</u> Read Aloud (Listening)

Learning Outcomes:

Students will explain that they understand what is happening in the book by answering comprehension questions verbally.

Content Standards:

C.4.3. Participate effectively in discussion.

4.2.5. Extend the literal meaning of a text by making inferences, and evaluate the significance and validity of texts in light of prior knowledge and experience.

Culture:

Chica Chica Bum Bum (Spanish Version) will be available to students to read and look at. It can also be read to the whole class.

Materials & Resources:

- -Chicka Chicka Boom Boom by Bill Martin and John Archambault
- -A blackboard, smartboard or white board with the following headings written and spaced out:
 - -Characters, Setting, Beginning, Middle, and End

Exploratory Introduction:

Show the book cover to the class and ask students to infer what the book is about.

Procedures:

- 1. Introduce the headings on the board.
- 2. Tell students to listen to the story because you will be asking questions.
- 3. Read the story and stop often to check for comprehension.
- 4. Ask, "What do you think will happen next?"
- 5. When the story is done, ask students if they know who the characters are in the story.
- 6. Follow by asking the setting, beginning, middle and end.

Accommodations:

For E.L.L. students: Read Chica Chica Bum Bum (Spanish Version) before reading the English version.

Adaptations:

Go over comprehension questions one on with students after they have listened to the book at the listening center.

Assessment:

Students will verbally answer the comprehension questions correctly.
