Name of Lesson: Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Book Covers (Visually Representing)

Learning Outcomes:

Students will create their own book cover for Chicka Chicka Boom Boom.

Content Standards:

G.4.1Students will know that art communicates ideas

Materials & Resources:

- 1. Chicka Chicka Boom Boom Book by Bill Martin
- 2. Construction Paper (Green, Black & Bown). Enough for each student to have one of each color.
- 3. Precut yellow suns. One for each student.
- 4. Student's names precut in multicolor capital letters.
- 5. Glue sticks
- 6. Scissors

Exploratory Introduction:

Read Chicka Chicka Boom Boom to the class.

Procedures:

- 1. Point out the illustrators name (Lois Ehlhert) on the cover of the book.
- 2. Open the pages of the book and show the illustrations on each page.
- 3. Tell students they will illustrate their own covers for their own alphabet books.
- 4. Show the sample made by the teacher.
- 5. Demonstrate how it was made.
- 6. Explain to students that their cover does not have to look exactly like the sample or original cover.
- 7. Allow students to use scissors or tear the construction paper.
- 8. Pass out letters.
- 9. Have students spell their name out on their tables/desks.
- 10. Check that names are spelled correctly before you proceed.
- 11. Pass out the rest of the materials.
- 12. Assist students in creating their covers.

Accommodations:

Students will be allowed to use left handed scissors.

Students will work with a classroom helper or teacher.

Students will be given the option to use crayons and draw rather than cut and glue.

Adaptations:

Students will be given their own example to look at. Students will work with a classroom helper or teacher.

Assessment:

Students will have a finished product of their own cover with all the materials used and their name spelled correctly. Display covers.
